Clinton to compete as independent team in 2013

This year could be the turnaround for Clinton County Football. It has been looking for since its rebirth several years ago.

Head Coach Jamie Miller is now in his fifth year as head coach and he said now he has a schedule he can live with.

In the past several years, Clinton County started in single A competition, moved to 2A last season, and now has dropped out of district play all together in order to create a schedule that will put the Dawgs up against teams of the same caliber.

"In district play, you have games that you have to schedule. Now we have 10 games we can schedule how we want to," Miller said. "We try to have five away and five home. We came up with a list of about 25 schools ... It's worked out really well for us."

Moving out of district competition means the team doesn't have to schedule three games inside their district pairings, allowing three games for opponents who are similarly matched.

"We are going to compete as an independent team ... competing against schools with our same size and experience level," Miller said. "When you take 30 kids and play a team who has 80 kids, you are at a disadvantage. Most of the schools we play will have similar numbers to us. When you play teams who have similar numbers, you tend to compete better with them especially at the beginning of the year."

This season, Miller said he is looking at dressing 33 players to begin the 2013 season.

"Our numbers are up," Miller said. "We have several seniors, which means a lot of returning players from last season. We potentially lost four players from last season, so most of our guys

have quite a bit of game experience. I have a couple of additions who didn't play in the past who I think will be key this season."

Clinton County's first game will come on Friday, August 23, against Pickett County at home. The Bulldogs will also be home the next week, August 30, against Trimble County. During the month of September, the Dawgs will be on the road with four straight away games against McCreary County, Jenkins, Caverna and Metcalfe County.

Following the Metcalfe County game on September 27, the Dawgs will be back at home for a two game stretch against Lynn Camp on October 4, and Red Boiling Springs on October 11. Following the October 11 game, Clinton County will have a week off from games, and pick back up on October 25, as the team travels to Clay County, Tennessee. On November 1, the Dawgs will play its final game of the season at Bulldog field against Jackson County.

All games are scheduled for a kick off time of 7 p.m., with the exceptions of the McCreary County and Jenkins games, which will begin at 8 p.m.

According to Miller, this year's team will pass the ball more than in years past. He has been working on the offense since the first official day of practice on July 15.

"We've been working on our passing game," Miller said. "We've had three days where we've worked against other schools. Two days against York Institute and we did really well against them. I was very pleased with our effort and attitude."

During the summer months, Miller said it is very important to work with other teams on offense

and defense. It gives the teams a look at different playing strategies in order to prepare for the season.

"The best thing to do, when you get into pads, is to have a three or four team scrimmage that way you are seeing more offenses and defenses. In Kentucky, we are only allowed to have one full contact scrimmage and it can last no longer than three hours."

During preseason practice and the summer months, heat has been an issue in the past, but with the mild summer already behind us, Miller said he didn't have to worry about the heat index that much this preseason.

"I checked it a couple of times on hot days and I think once I checked it when it was 88 degrees, but it was actually a very dry day, so it wasn't a problem," Miller said.

In order to have a high school team with a good amount of players, athletes have to start at a young age and this season will mark the first class who has made it all the way through the feeder program.

"I think I have two who have played all the way through in Clinton County," Miller said. "I think Austin and Tyler Stearns are the only two who started in the third grade and who will be seniors this year. There has been some who started in the third grade, skipped a couple of years, then came back. Being able to get the middle school teams to do some of the same stuff we do really helps. When they get to the high school level, they know what we are doing. They will have a general understanding of what we are doing once they get to high school."

Behind Coach Miller this

season will be Jay Thaxton, DeWayne Dalton, Mitch Latham, Mark Dalton and Robbie Davis.

"Coach Thaxton was actually my college coach, so he and I are on the same page and we communicate real well together. DeWayne and Mitch are real sharp and they know everything that is going on," Miller said. "With Robbie and Mark being new, they are doing a good job. They are catching on and I think they are going to be assets to us. My guys are hard working and they know what we need to do to get the most out of our kids. Each coach has different abilities as far as communication with the kids is concerned. With the personalities we have on staff, I think we are a great combination."

Fans got a first look at Clin-

ton County Football on Saturday, August 17, as the team held its first annual Meet the Bulldogs. For those who didn't get a chance to see the Dawgs in action, Miller said this year's team will be more wide open on the field.

"A lot of times last year we kind of got one dimensional. We are going to have multiple offenses and we are going to throw the ball more," Miller said. "On defense, we will have our base defense and we will stem out of that. We want to try and make it more confusing on offenses and hopefully more unpredictable. I think this is a year where we have some big play-making abilities. We have some tremendous athletes who will be handling the ball for us and they will make some big plays this season."

Last season, the Dawgs went 0-11 and haven't won a game since September 18, 2009, against Caverna. This year, Miller thinks it will be the turnaround season he has been waiting for during the past four years.

"I want everybody to come out and see the new and improved Bulldogs," Miller said. "We are a growing program and every year we get bigger and I think this year could be a turning point for us."

Updates for games and practices for the football teams will be listed on Friends of Football Facebook page this season.

Clinton County's first game of the season will be at Bulldog Field, Friday, August 23, at 7 p.m. against Pickett County.

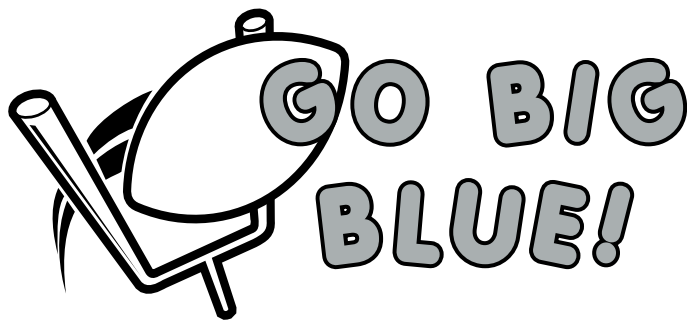

Senior experience will lead team to new territory this season

The Clinton County Volley Dawgs return to the court this fall for what is expected to be an amazing season.

The varsity team brings seven seniors to the floor, as well as a host of underclassmen with plenty of experience.

Head Coach Pam Ostertag has been at the head coaching spot for five years and has been apart of the volley ball team since the 2004-2005 season where she started as an assistant under Jeff Pharis.

This season, Ostertag has some new blood on the sidelines as Morgan Hicks and Michelle Wray will be assisting.

"Michelle Wray brings the experience of hitting and blocking to the table," Ostertag said. "We also have Morgan Hicks and she brings the defense because she was a libero in high school."

Both Morgan and Wray played for Ostertag in high school. Wray said she is very excited about the start of the new season.

On the court, Clinton County will be led by four seniors, Juliann Mullins, Taylor Delk, Sarah Glover, Baylee Baker, Patricia Brown, Caiti Choate, and Julianna Smith.

"They have great chemistry," Ostertag said. "Their quality of individual experience is a lot higher this season. They are really coming along on their passing which means we can run more offense and plays."

Experience will be something Clinton County will have plenty of this season with seven seniors, two sophomores and three freshmen.

"Probably 80 percent of a volleyball team needs to be chem-

istry," Ostertag said. "They know where each other is at all times."

Getting ready for the new season begins much earlier than the July 15 official practice date. Ostertag said she has taken the team on several camps this summer, some of which were not mandatory, however, she said most of the team participated.

"We took the varsity to UK for a one day camp and that was just scrimmaging other teams all day. We also went to Wayne County for a camp," Ostertag said. "In the summer time, its not mandatory, but we had most of the team with us. I want them to learn all six positions on the floor because at one point during their high school career, they may be playing any one of those six spots."

In the rules of volleyball, each team can have a libero on the floor, whose main job is defense. Whoever is designated in that spot wears a different color uniform and mainly stays in the back row on the floor. A libero can substitute at any time throughout the game.

"If we didn't have to have a libero then we could use a regular uniform and that person would then become a normal player," Ostertag said.

The Volley Dawgs started this season on August 19 at home against Adair County, followed by a road stretch of five games including the All "A" Classic Regional in Russellville on August 24 against Cumberland County.

The Dawgs' next home game will come on September 12 against Cumberland County with a 5:30 start time for the freshman, followed by the junior varsity and then the varsity.

On September 16, Clinton County will host Glasgow which will be the team's annual "Pink Out" night.

"They look forward to it every year," Ostertag said. "They are so in-tune to helping people."

The Volley Dawgs have the "Pink Out" night in order to raise awareness about cancer. Last year's event included a silent auction and a serving game for the fans. Fans can come out on the floor and serve volleyballs for prizes.

During the past several years, volleyball's crowd of fans have grown and Ostertag has noticed.

"Once you come to your first game you will be hooked," Ostertag said. "It's fast paced and it could be over just like that. There is a lot of hitting and blocking ... It's really exciting."

The district pairings for volleyball is the same as basket-

ball's district pairings with Russell County, Metcalfe County and Cumberland County.

"The district is at Cumberland County this year," Ostertag said. "I always hope we are on top. Once you get to district, it doesn't matter what your record is at the end of the season. The tournament is totally different. It's a different atmosphere when it comes to district and regional."

Ostertag said she was excited for the season to get started.

"I'm excited to see what the girls are going to bring," Ostertag said. "If they play like I think they are going to play, its going to be a very successful season. We are changing our offense up a little bit, so we will have three hitters and two blocking in the front."

Golf teams in full swing, boys and girls playing home matches at Dale Hollow

The Clinton County Golf teams will once again call Dale Hollow Lake State Resort Park its home for the upcoming season.

With official practice starting July 15, both teams have already had matches under its belts and both seasons are off and running.

For the boys' team, newly hired Head Coach Nick Irwin recently took the position, along with new assistant coach's Adam Marcum and Sawyer Stalcup.

"Adam is a shot doctor and Sawyer is a walking rule book," Irwin said. "I think I can keep my basics covered with them two."

Clinton County's first match came in the shape of a tournament held at Dale Hollow, where the team finished 12th out of 23 teams with a score of 341 on 18 holes.

Kenny Stinson finished with an 82, Kolby Smith scored an 84, Jeff Brown shot an 87 and John Crouch rounded out scoring with an 88.

The boys team also played host during a regular match at Dale Hollow Tuesday, August 6, against Cumberland County and Metcalfe County.

The Golf Dawgs won the tri-match, 164 to Cumberland County's 188 and Metcalfe County's 189.

Individual scoring was Smith - 38, Reed Sloan - 41, Brown - 42, and Crouch - 43.

"Our junior class is loaded this year," Irwin said. "We have

four really good players and all four of them will be in the top five this season. We are real young, strong, but young.

Playing at Dale Hollow week in and week out is one of the upsides to both teams. Labeled as one of the nicest courses in the state, it provides challenges for the players as they learn the game, which will give them the experience needed when playing other courses this season.

"You have great greens down here. They are going to check up," Irwin said. "Playing here and practicing here is going to give them an advantage."

Playing golf in the late summer/early fall can be a challenge in itself for the players. Irwin believes playing Dale Hollow is good for his player's stamina.

"Walking up and down these hills carrying a 30 pound bag ... there are some places we have to cart them from hole to hole because it's that extreme," Irwin said. "Playing 18 holes here will wear you out quick."

With having a young team, Irwin said it has been hard to break the new players of bad habits they have developed during the past couple of season, but he is optimistic about the season ahead.

"Golf is the easy part," Irwin said. "We've been on to them about playing the role also ... playing good and looking good. We make them wear nice shorts with no holes in them, no t-shirts

... the little things like that is going to take some time to get used to. They have been real receptive of us so far. I didn't know how it was going to transition from Nathan (Garner) to us, but they are hungry to get better and that means a lot. Usually teams loaded with juniors and sophomores, know more than you know at that point, but it's not that way with this group."

As far as the girls' team is concerned, even though most are underclassmen, they have been playing golf for several years now and could add plenty of leadership to the team.

"Most all of my players have 3 or more years experience under their belt. With the exception of London Honeycutt, a 6th grader, who just started last year. We play in one of the if not the toughest regions in the state in girls golf. We have the talent and potential of being right in the thick of things, when I can get these girls to have faith in themselves. These young ladies play as good as anyone in the region when we have practice, it just seems that they may put too much pressure on themselves when we play in tournaments. Their scores in tournaments have not thus far been an exact reflection of their capability and talent," Lynn Starnes said.

Veteran Head Golf Coach Starnes already has several tournaments and matches complete this season and she is excited

about another year as coach.

"Thus far we have been in three tournaments, opening up our season with two back-to-back 18-hole tournaments on a Friday and Saturday. Talk about a physical workout! The girls walk all 18 holes and are responsible for carrying their clubs. We have played in the Monroe Co. Invitational, Taylor County Invitational and just two weekends ago we played in the Barren Co. Invitational at Barren River Lake State Park. Ansley Stalcup missed being a medalist by just a few strokes in the first two tournaments, and Macy Campbell posted her season low at Barren River Lake State Park.

Playing at one of the best courses in the state of Kentucky is something that will make any team better and with both the boys and girls holding its home matches at Dale Hollow State Park, the course will be a teaching element all in its own.

"Having the opportunity to play on one of the top golf courses in the State of Kentucky, at DHLSP has been such a blessing. It provides many challenges on a daily basis for us...sand traps, long holes, plush greens that can be slick as glass," Starnes said. "I feel the opportunity to play on this elite course only makes us better as golfers as well as truly learning some of life's lessons in etiquette, as well as how to treat

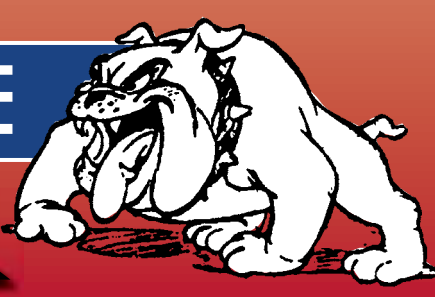

people both on and off the golf course. We are able to see and meet a lot of people from around the state and this too has been a great opportunity for our players."

This year, Starnes said her team is focusing on lowering their scores during the season.

"As for team goals we are focusing on each girls getting their scores in the 80's as a minimum with a couple setting their goal to be in the low 70's," Starnes said. "Another team goal is to keep out putting to a two-putt max on each hole. Once we start doing this both individually and as a team, we are going to experience even more success."

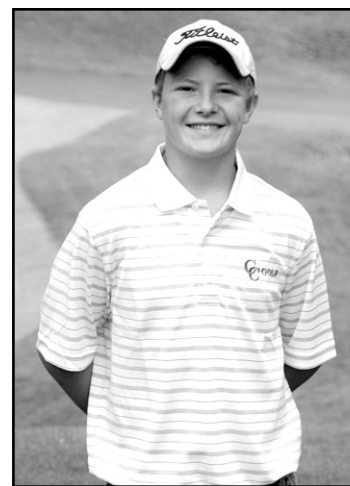

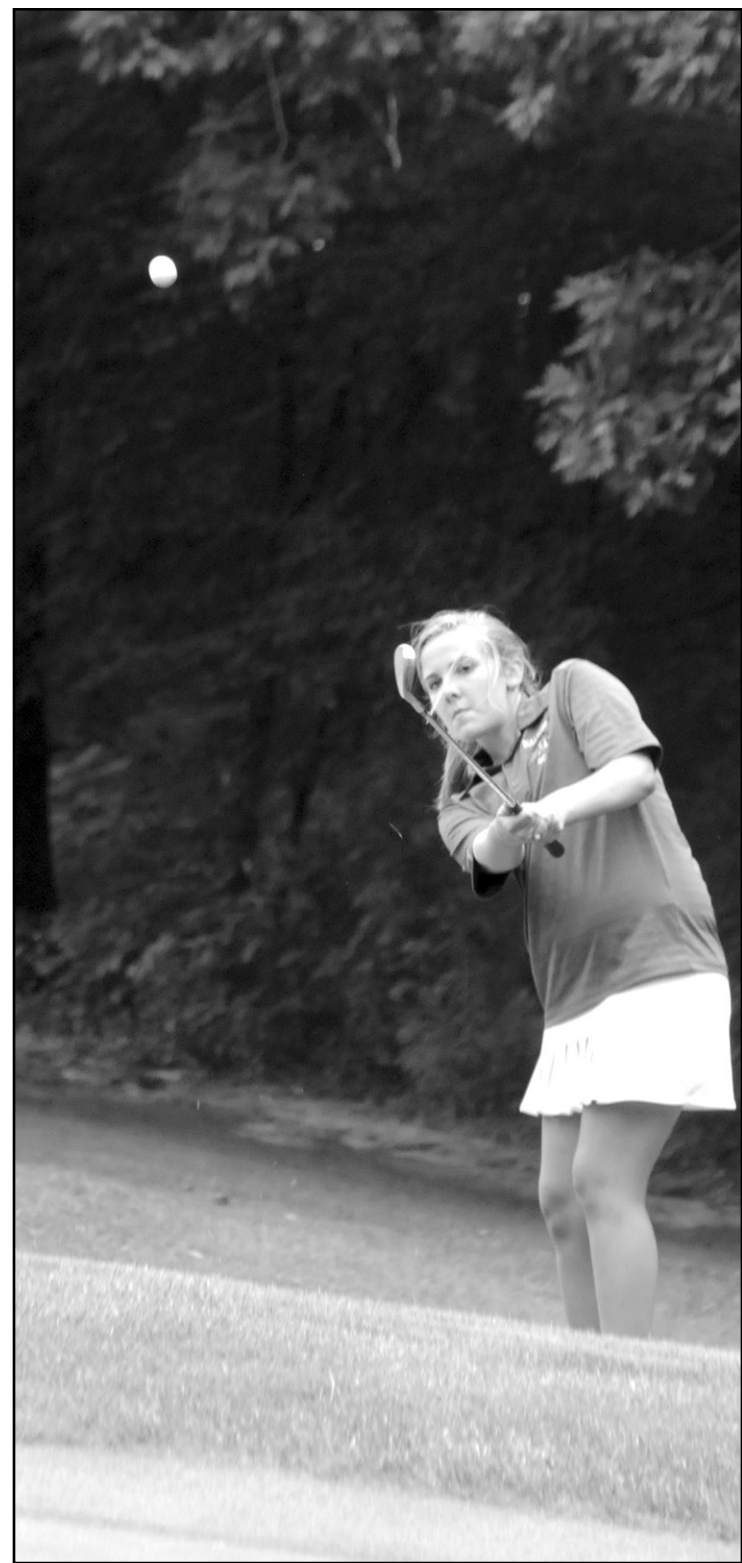

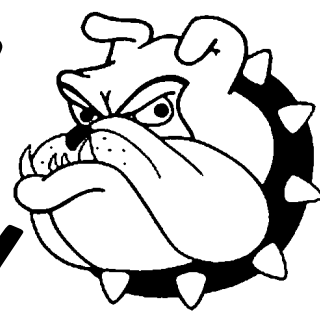

Soccer teams look forward to third season

As the 2013 school year rolls around, fall sports are in full swing and with soccer once again being on that list of fall sports, Head Coach Greg Cummings is excited to get the third year underway.

"They've been going full out everyday," Cummings said. "They've actually come in shape and that makes a big difference. When you come to practice already in shape, it makes a world of difference."

Last season, the Soccer Dawgs finished 3-12 and Cummings is looking to improve greatly on last season's record.

"We should have a special team this year. We will compete with about every team we play. Whether they win or lose is one thing, but they should compete with everybody," Cummings said. "This is the season I've been waiting for because all these kids who wanted a soccer program are now seniors. I said a couple of years ago that if I could keep some of these players we would have a good soccer team. Now it's here ... this is it."

Cummings coached both the girls and the boys team the first year, half a season, and last season Amanda (Conyers) Reneau was hired as the girls coach. Reneau will continue her role as head coach this season.

Both teams, according to Cummings, have greatly improved over the past three years.

Clinton County is in a district with Barren County, Glasgow and Monroe County. Cummings said it's a three team district because Monroe County only has a girls team.

The Soccer Dawgs will play each team in its district both home and away this season, in order to set post season play.

Cummings is very optimistic

both teams will be playing in the district finals.

"Looking at the schedule, it's going to be us and Glasgow to determine who goes to the regional," Cummings said. "The teams I've scheduled to play this year fits Glasgow's playing style, so I'm trying to get as much competition like them as I can. South Laurel is just like Glasgow, so we play them two times."

Clinton County will see six senior boys and two senior girls on this year's roster.

"They bond so well together," Cummings said. "They all get along and they have fun when they play."

On the girls side, Cummings said he has been practicing the girls during the past couple of weeks in order to give Reneau extra time during the season to be at the games.

The girls have the same core group returning, with eight starters returning from last season.

"They are committed," Cummings said. "If I could get four or five other athletic girls to play, I think they could beat Barren County. They will win at least eight games this season ... that's what I'm predicting. They have the potential and the schedule to do that. Going three games to eight the next is a huge step, but it's possible for them."

Last season the girls' soccer team finished its season with three wins and 15 losses. This year, the team is hoping to improve on last year's season and make it to the district finals with a change at going to the region for the first time.

"Glasgow is by far the best on the girls' side and we have a good chance to beat them," Cummings said.

Both the boys and the girls team will be playing in the All

"A" regional finals due to Todd County Central backing out of the tournament. The girls team will play the winner of Glasgow and Monroe County for a chance to go to the All "A" State tournament.

The boys will play Glasgow in the regional final, since Monroe County doesn't field a boys soccer team.

"Both teams should be exciting to watch this season," Cummings said.

Another new aspect to this year's season, will be the venue in which both teams will play. Last season, every game was held at the middle school soccer field. This year, Cummings said nine game will be held at the high school on the football field.

There are several players on both soccer teams who are involved in other sports throughout the year and Cummings said this is a key factor in getting and keeping the kids in shape during soccer season.

"Some do cross country, football, basketball ... Mid-fielders will run around five miles per game," Cummings said. "Others will run around two to three miles during a game. The good thing is we have a lot of players this year so we can give players a lot of rest. We should be strong throughout the year. People don't realize how physical soccer is until they come out and watch a game."

The Clinton County girls team will play host to Barren County on August 29 at home, middle school field at 6:30 p.m.

The boys will play Hart County on August 22 and Wayne County on August 29. Both games will be played on the football field and will be start at 5 p.m.

Cross Country enjoys new popularity

This year's Clinton County Cross Country team already has one scrimmage run under their belt and are looking forward to the new season.

Third year Head Coach Di-pesh Soma said they have been training since official practice started July 15.

"We've been hard at it since then," Soma said. "We have incorporated a new tactic this year which is more strength training. We do it about three days a week. A lot of these kids don't run year round. A lot of these schools who win the region are logging in miles after miles day after day. That's why we are doing the strength training ... to try and close that gap up the other schools are gaining on us."

Soma has a host of meets scheduled this season, including the Foothills Festival 5K run in October. Each meet is typically 3.1 miles for the runners. Soma

said it is sometimes below that, but the Kentucky High School Athletic Association doesn't want to go beyond that distance.

"There are some in the early season that are less ... some are like 2.5 or 2.6 miles," Soma said. "It's challenging for them."

With the host of students on this year's team. Soma has several who play other sports as well. Using the sport of cross country helps with conditioning in other sports.

"It probably helps basketball more than anything," Soma said. "It helps with endurance. Soccer and cross country is a great combination because soccer is 90 minutes full force. It really helps soccer."

During the past several years the popularity of the sport has grown.

"This is the first year I've had a full girls team," Soma said. "I will have a full girls team and

boys team to qualify for state. That's a plus in my book. Running in general in this area is getting bigger. It seems like I see more and more people wanting to run distance. You can tell by the Foothills race. It's picked up in the past four or five years. It helps having more popularity with the sport."

Other than the Foothills Festival 5K, the Runnin' Dawgs will spend their entire season traveling to meets.

"Hopefully by next year I will be able to host a couple meets," Soma said. "We was supposed to host the regional meet this year,

but we got re-districted. We are in the same region, but other teams have been added, so they had to split the districts up a little."

The Runnin' Dawgs' first meet will be August 31 in Bowling Green, KY. Soma said this year's regional meet is held at the same location, so runners will know what to expect during the post season run.

"I have high expectations this year," Soma said. "Last year we missed state, but this year I'm hoping to make it back. Hopefully we have a better year this year."
