Bat Dawgs see new coach take the reigns

Clinton County's Baseball team has been tossing the ball around for several weeks now with the team's first game coming on March 13 with a double header. The Bat Dawgs picked up two wins over Sunbright, Tenn., 16-3 and 14-0.

Last season, the Bat Dawgs finished the year with a 3-28 record and a first round district loss to Russell County, 10-0, under former Head Coach Patrick Stalcup.

This season, newly hired Head Coach Michial Conner

takes the leadership role and is very optimistic about the upcoming season.

Clinton County brings a lot of youth to the field this year, but also has some senior leadership on the team as well with five seniors on the roster.

Travis Starns, Noah Cummings, Parker Means, Tyler Stearns, Eli Brown and Daniel Mills will be on the field as seniors this season, with several juniors and a host of sophomores and freshmen and one eighth grader completing the lineup.

"We have lots of sophomores, lots of freshmen and one eighth grader," Conner said. "Their minds will wander and get a little off, but the seniors pull them right back in. I've seen Travis Starns pull all the outfield in together and have a breakdown. He will talk to them, pep them up and it's a total different club."

Conner spent the previous year as the middle school coach and with the older squad this season, he said it's a huge difference.

"They are not what I'm used

to for sure," Conner said. "They are willing to learn the game and get better everyday. Anytime I open the cage they are here and they are wanting to be here. At times, on Sunday when I'm at home they are wanting to be here. They live and breathe baseball."

Conner said the team's desire to improve is the reason he thinks they will be a special team this season.

The Bat Dawgs, are deep in the position of pitching. For high school or any level of baseball, pitching is the key to both a solid offense and defense.

Last year they threw about five to six pitchers," Conner said. "This year we are going to throw 14 different pitchers. Of the 14, six have no varsity time, but they have pitched in middle school and some junior varsity and three of them have never pitched a game in their life. Eli Brown came in one game and threw 48 pitches and he had 26 strikes and struck out two with no experience on the mound at all."

Being able to work his players, even with the harsh winter Clinton County has faced, Conner said he is thankful they have an indoor facility where he can work on the fundamentals during the winter months.

"Eli has been working since October," Conner said. "I love being able to get them in here during the winter. We have six or seven that can really throw at the varsity level and will get a lot of baseball games. We will be able to compete with the Russell Counties and compete with Monroe County."

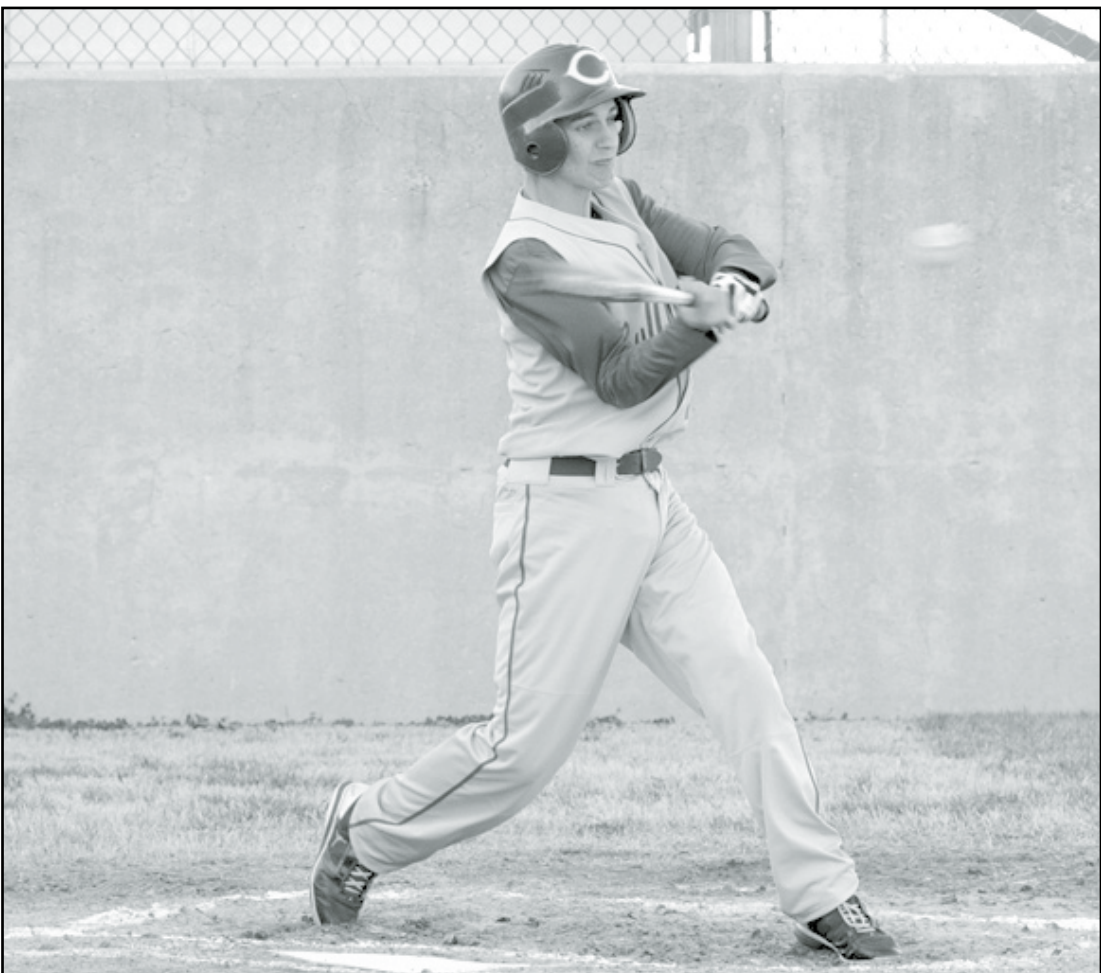
This year's district tournament will be held at Clinton County and Conner likes his

chances to move on to the regional tournament this post season.

"Honestly, I know we can

beat Cumberland County so if we get two wins there and split

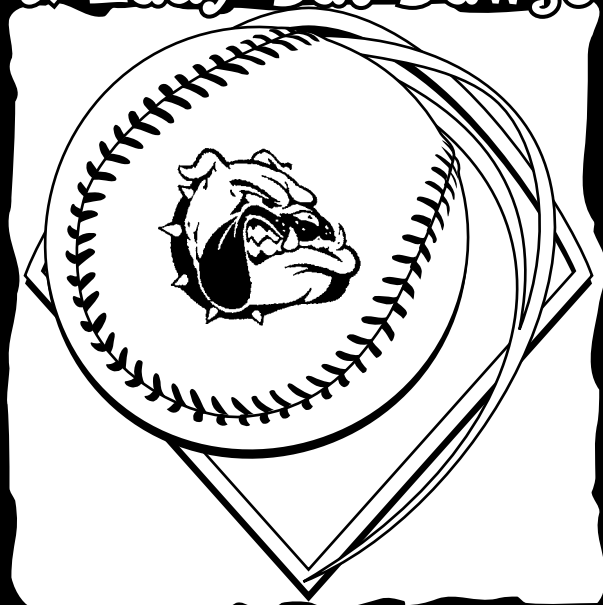

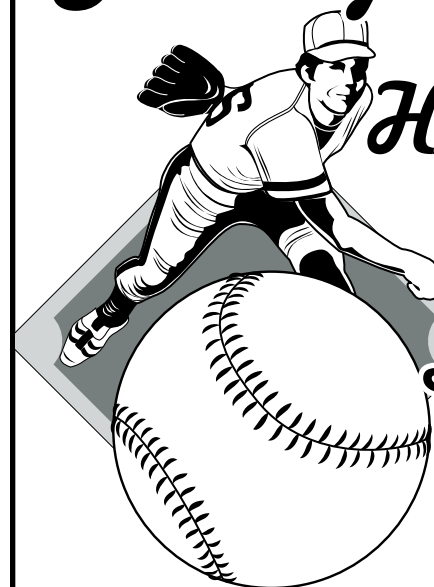

with Metcalfe County we will be good," Conner said. "I know

we will be able to compete with Metcalfe County and Russell County. It's not going to be a 10-run rule like it has in the past. It's going to come down to the wire. Our defense is solid ... the only thing we are struggling with is getting our bats going and getting that big early inning, but if

we can do that then we will win a lot of baseball games."

Conner's newly appointed rules for his team don't seem to be a problem. He wants his team ready and dressed for practice by 3:15, but Conner said they are usually ready much earlier, which says a lot about the char-

acter of the team.

"In the past you may have kids running around at 3:25 ... this year they are dressed and ready to go by 3:05. They are wanting to get here and ready to get things done. When they get here early, that's 10 more minutes of situations, bunting and hitting drills we can do," Conner said. "We work a lot on individual drills and this is something a lot of people at this level don't do. I believe this is where it starts to have a good consistent, productive infield. The other night, first scrimmage of the year, two errors ... that's it."

To pull nine or 10 guys together and have them work as a team is a hard feat to overcome, but Conner said his team is coming together nicely.

"We have a lot of athletes who are willing to work ... that's the big thing," Conner said. "I preach fundamentals. All the coaches are on my philosophy."

Along with Conner, Russell Baker will be this year's assistant coach, along with volunteers Jared Bertram and Devin Brown.

"Baker came from Louisville and played for Valley so he knows what it's like. Jared Bertram came out during his spring break and was here everyday helping with the pitching. He pitches at Lindsey Wilson, so he knows some tricks that I don't know because I never pitched at the college level. I didn't play first base, so Devin has really been good at working with those players. They bring a lot to the table," Conner said. "From day one until now has been daylight and dark."

Field-wise Conner said he has had to add some clay all over the infield where it holds water during the winter months, as well as rebuilding the mound for the upcoming season.

"We had to put four truck loads of clay on the mound in

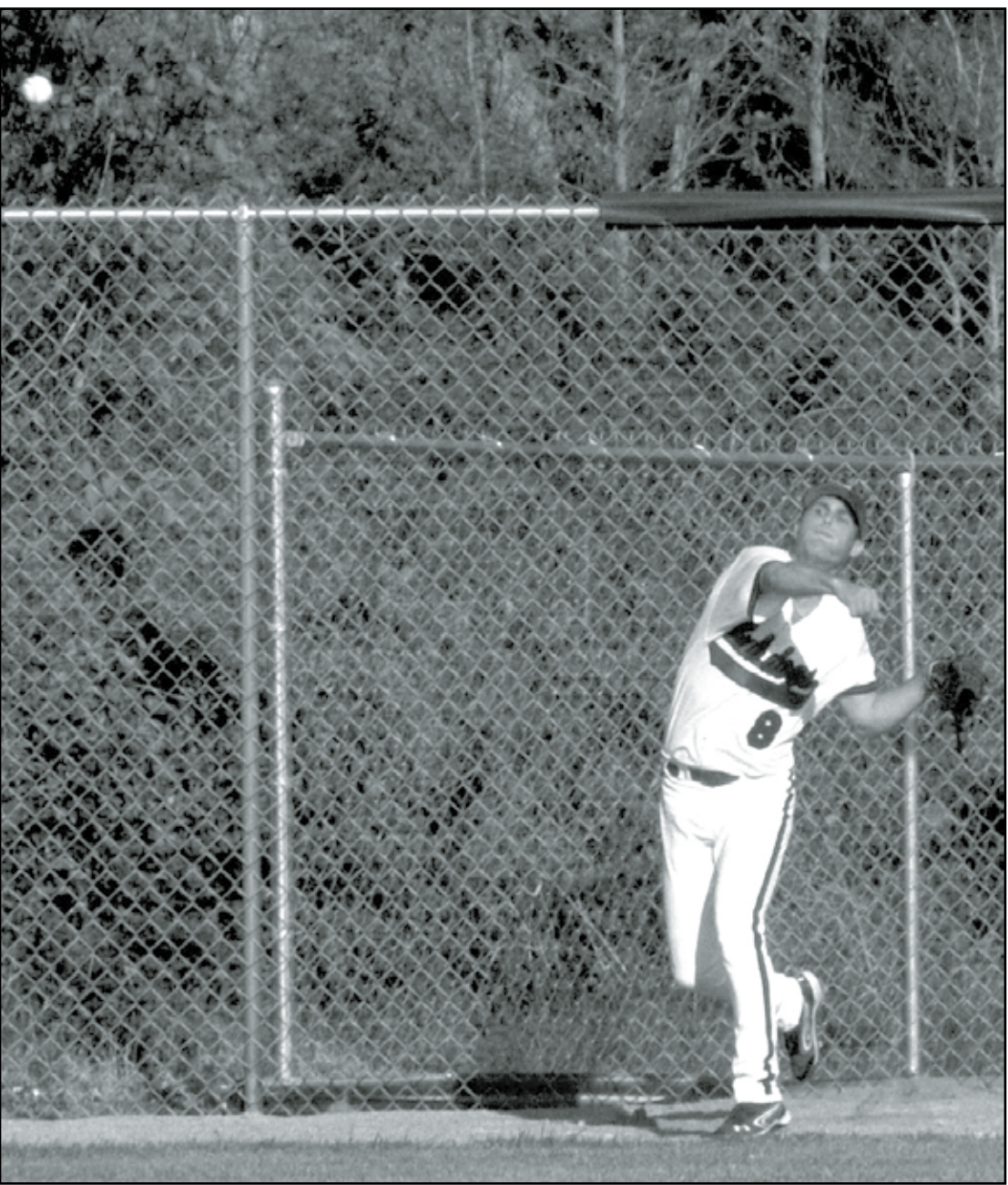
order to bring it up four inches," Conner said. "We put a new rubber in and new bases. The mound is probably the best in the district and that's what the umpires have said."

Conner said he has already had a lot of support from the community with new signs up around the field. Some of the other renovations include new fencing in front of the dugouts as well as a new entry point into and out of the dugout in the middle. Before this year, players entered and exited the dugout from the ends, but now they will be able to enter and exit with the middle

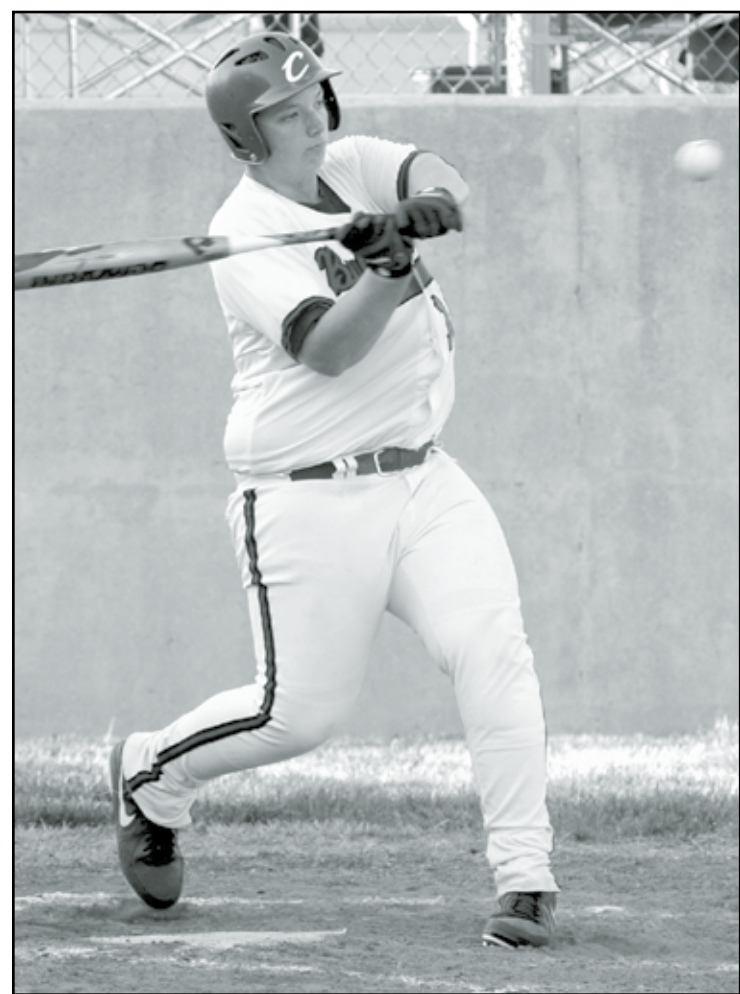
opening. "We also got new bleachers in the dugout," Conner said. "Half the time the kids want to be out on a bucket in front of the screen, so this will help them get into the game a little better. We've made it a little more player friendly."

The Bat Dawgs will be in action this week with games on Thursday at Wayne County and Friday at home against Jackson County, Tenn.

The Bat Dawgs are 5-1 this season, which is the best start for Clinton County in several seasons.

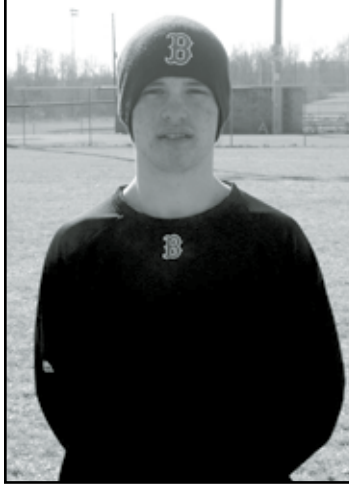

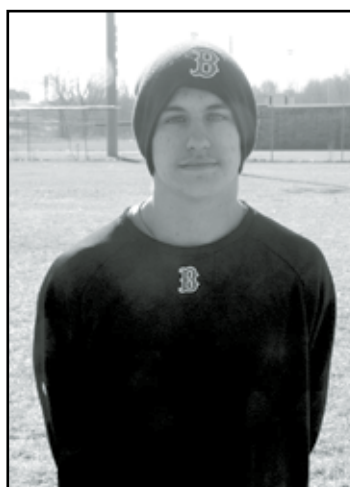

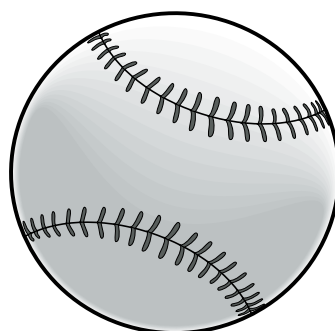

Lady Bat Dawgs field a young team for upcoming season

The Clinton County Lady Bat Dawgs have been practicing since February 15 and are ready for the upcoming season.

This year Clinton County will be a young team according to Head Coach Darrell Thompson.

"Softball-wise when you only have four seniors ... that's young, especially when you play some teams who have six and seven seniors," Thompson said. "This group of seniors have played about as much softball as any group who has come through."

Team leadership is a dynamic every team needs and Clinton County has more than enough leadership to go around.

"I was telling some of the other coaches that Ansley Stalcup has become a vocal leader on the basketball floor and I think that will carry over into softball," Thompson said. "I think you will see her as a big leader this year ... taking charge of the infield."

This season Clinton County also returns one of its core pitchers with Amber Allen as a junior on this year's squad. Also on the mound will be senior Mariah Maupin who has some varsity time on the mound in previous years.

"We are going to be deep in the catcher position this year and that's a position you have to be deep in," Thompson said. "I think we will be good up the middle as well. I think defensively we will be better than we were last season. My biggest concern is hitting right now. I think in years past we are two years past from scoring 300 runs per season. Now we are going to have to play more small ball. Hit and runs, bunting, slapping ... you will see more of that this season." Thompson said as a team,

the overall speed of the players, is probably the best he has seen since he has been coaching.

"We have some young girls who are very quick on the base path," Thompson said.

District-wise, Clinton County has a tough road ahead with Cumberland County and Russell County getting the majority of last season's team back this year.

"Those are teams now where you can throw in six or seven seniors and that makes a difference. If you had to rate them, you have Cumberland and Russell, then you throw us in there and Metcalfe may be a little down this season just because they lost their main pitcher to graduation." Thompson said he thinks teams will have a hard time scoring against the Lady Bat Dawgs this season and with the offense playing small ball, it could mean a lot when coming down to a tight game in the seventh inning.

"It's something we have to change the mentality of the whole team," Thompson said. "They all have to buy into it." Last season, the Lady Bat Dawgs lost in the first round of the District Tournament to Metcalfe County in a 2-0 decision.

Clinton County finished the year with a 10-17 record and Thompson hopes to get a district championship this season since the district tournament will be held in Clinton County.

"Since we are hosting the district we are going to have to do some cosmetic things to the field, but all in all I think the field is in good shape," Thompson said. "We get to hold the district so we have to get the field in top notch shape. I think we have the best field in the district and in the region, we are right there in the top five in the region with our field."

This season, much like in the past few seasons, Clinton County will play in several weekend tournaments and with the economy the way it is, Thompson said it makes sense to travel and play three or four teams in one or two days, than it does to only play one game per day through the week.

"If you play a home game, you are out about \$300, but for \$200 I can go and play four games," Thompson said. "From the financial standpoint it makes a lot of sense. Eventually I would like to host a tournament here. You can get your four games in and make a little money and stay home. That's our goal for next year."

The Lady Bat Dawgs will play weekend tournaments at Todd Central, Rockcastle County, Somerset, and Bowling Green. Thompson explained how the team can play many games in one day.

"It's different than in baseball. With Amber, she can throw multiple innings and multiple games and you can get three or four games in on a Saturday."

Thompson has been coaching softball since 1994, with only three year's absent from the position inside the past 20 years.

This year could be his last as of right now.

"It takes young blood to do this now," Thompson said.

Clinton County's first game came Friday, March 21, at home against Barren County. The Lady Bat Dawgs will be in action this week, with games on Friday against Somerset in the Southwestern Invitational. Clinton County will be back at home on Monday, March 31 against Pulaski County.

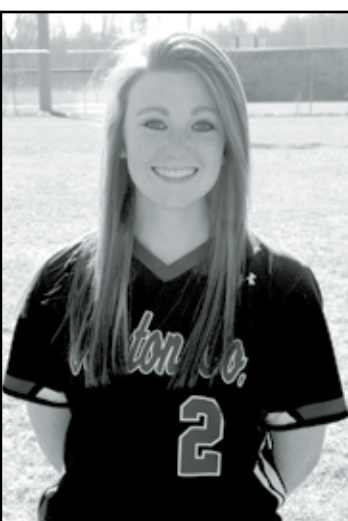

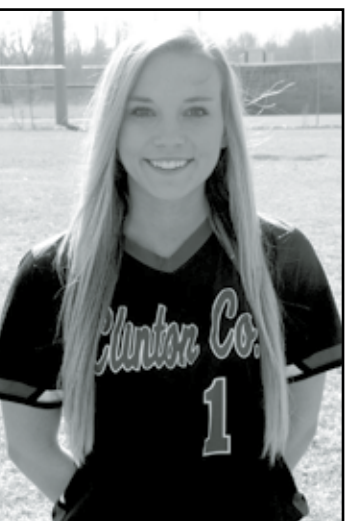

Racket Dawgs see new coach push conditioning

This year's Racket Dawgs have a host of new players, as well as some veterans making up the roster this season. Three seniors lead the way for the Racket Dawgs with Chesney Polston, Amber Brown and Chris Cox. Other members include several juniors, sophomores and freshmen. Also new to the sport of tennis this season is Head Coach Dipesh Soma. Soma is currently the Runnin' Dawgs head coach and is looking forward to adding tennis to his resume. One aspect of Soma's take on coaching tennis is pushing a tough conditioning schedule in order to get his players in shape and ready for the season. "I played all four years in high school and it has changed since then," Soma said. "For the first year, I'm just trying to get a little discipline in and work on

conditioning. I'm hoping for a successful first year." With Soma being the Cross County Head Coach, he said the conditioning is a little different for tennis because it is not as demanding as running three miles per day. berland County. With only three seniors on both the boys' and girls' team, Soma said he has a lot of juniors that will bring leadership to the team. Soma has had his teams out on the courts since February 15, the official start of spring sports, and he said it has been a pretty

productive spring so far. "When I don't have practice here at the courts, I take them to the Wellness Center and we will do more conditioning there," Soma said. "We've only had to cancel practice on the snow days. I try to have practice six days a week right now, but that will dwindle down as the season progresses." With several matches already under the team's belt, Soma is excited about the year to come. "I'm excited about it," Soma said. "I'm excited to start something else besides cross country. It's a little more to do in the year and I love helping the kids."

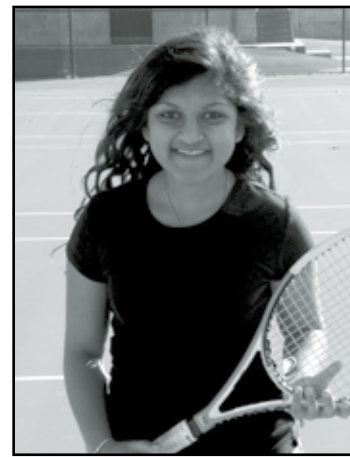

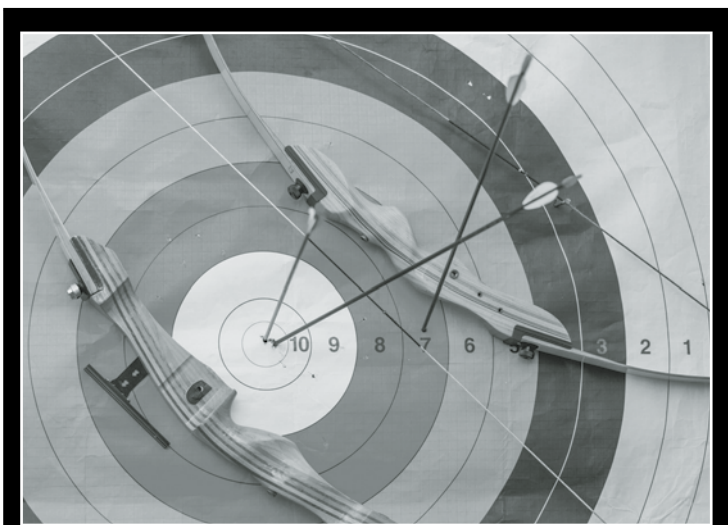



New 'sport' shows numbers and enthusiasm

The Clinton County High School Archery is now in its second year under the direction of the Kentucky High School Athletic Association, which means the sport is now classified as a high school sport and not a club.

Before the KHSAA got involved, archery was under the direction of the National Archery in the Schools Program or NASP. While KHSAA has regulations on archery, the format of the NASP has been integrated into the sport and very little changes have occurred since it has been classified under KHSAA.

Clinton County's High School team is under the direction of Head Coach Kathleen Gregory. Gregory has coached the team for the past eight years. "I took it really when nobody else would and I really enjoy it," Gregory said. "My kids were involved and I didn't want to see the program disappear."

Archers begin each round at 10 meters. Before the match begins, each archer gets a practice round of five arrows. After the practice round, each shooter shoots three rounds of five arrows each for a possible score of 150 from the 10 meter spot.

Once the 10 meter spot is complete, archers move back to 15 meters and three rounds of five arrows are shot for a total of 300.

Each student in the archery competition shoots the same bow, same arrows and it is limited on what each shooter can have on their bow. Gregory said this season KHSAA prohibited the use of Limbsavers on the bows which is a vibration dampening rubber piece located on the limbs of the bow.

What makes archery so interesting is that every shooter is

shooting the same equipment and no one has an advantage over the other.

With archery, it isn't just a team sport. Teams can qualify for state competitions, but also each individual can qualify as well.

"When KHSAA come on last year, its the same tournament as the NASP tournament, they are just giving out different trophies," Gregory said. "As a team you have to meet all the requirements to be able to compete under the KHSAA."

In order to have a good competing high school team, there must be a good feeder program in place and Gregory said there are a number of students all the way down to fourth grade who compete in the sport.

"We have a middle school division which consists of sixth, seventh and eighth, and we have an elementary division which is fourth and fifth grades," Gregory said. "I've kind of been the program director so I kind of oversee all the teams. We have a lot of freshmen and a lot of sophomores so we should have a pretty good team coming up."

Even though the archery team only competes in regionals and state competitions as of now, Gregory said her teams still compete on a state level with the other schools.

"We probably fall in the top 30 percent in the state," Gregory said. "We were second in the region this year at Logan County."

Gregory said they have so many students below the high school level they have had to single out grades to make up teams.

"We have a seventh and eighth grade team, a sixth grade team, a fifth grade team and a fourth grade team," Gregory said.

Clinton County's high school team is made up of 26 students, three seniors, one junior and the rest are sophomores and freshmen.

"We have some eighth graders who I feel will really add to our team in the next couple of years," Gregory said.

The season for archery is a little on the awkward side, being it doesn't start when the fall sports begin in August. Gregory said they hold their first open gym practice in October and usually finish up with the state shoot during the third week in March.

"In December, we usually hold tryouts for the team," Gregory said. "We officially start our practices in January."

One thing about archery that is much different than any other sport in Clinton County is, as of right now, the archery team doesn't have any archery shoots during its season other than the regional and state competitions.

Having home and away shoots is something Gregory said she would like to get started in the future in order to give students competition between other schools.

"We had talked about having a shoot this year, but due to conflicting issues with getting the gym and the weather, we weren't able to set it up," Gregory said.

Along with Gregory, Sandy Shelton and Chris Marcum help with the sport as assistant coaches.

"Sandy is actually a more experienced archer than I consider myself. She actually shoots in competitions and shoots for fun," Gregory said. "Chris Marcum actually works with 4H Shooting Sports and both of them have a lot of experience to bring with them."



The Clinton County High School Archery team has been established for eight years, but has only been recognized as a "sport" under the Kentucky High School Athletics Association for two years. Clinton County has a vast number of participants at the high school level, as well as middle school and elementary levels.
